In Primary Section for the year 2021-22, a total of 85 students got A* grade in all subjects in classes 1 & 2. In classes 3, 4 & 5 a total of 35 students got A1 grade in all subjects for the academic year 2021-22. There are a total of 120 academic prize winners in the primary section for the year 2021-22.

STUDENT AND STAFF STRENGTH

Established in 2007, we pride ourselves on our unique context. AECS-6 has classes from pre-prep to X STD. The total strength of the school is 823 out of whom 609 are DAE students, 94 belong to the Non DAE category and 120 come under RTE. The school has a total number of 33 teaching staff and 02 non-teaching staff.

CELEBRATIONS AND OBSERVANCES

The school had the following observances and celebrations during the academic year 2022-23

INVESTITURE CEREMONY

The investiture ceremony was conducted on 26th April 2022. Shri. Ramdas Vasudevan, Principal AECS-6, Mumbai was the Chief Guest on the occasion. The students were invested with ranks and were made a part of the school administration. Entrusting the students with responsibilities not only helps in the smooth functioning of the school but also prepares them to be better equipped to face the challenges of the world.

CCA ACTIVITIES

Co-curricular activities help to develop various facets of the personality development of the students as well as to strengthen the classroom learning. These are true and practical experiences received by students. With a view to inculcate the spirit of healthy competition, team spirit, leadership, co-operation, mutual understanding etc. among the students different activities like Article writing, Elocution, debate competition, Solo singing, Group singing, Group dance, Art Competition, Story writing & Essay writing, Greeting Card Making, Collage making, Origami etc. were conducted.

SCIENCE, MATHS AND ENGLISH CLUB ACTIVITIES:

Mathematics, Science and English Language and Art clubs have become a platform to organize various activities to bring out the latent talents of children and nurture their hobbies and passions. Each club organized different activities and competitions pertinent to the nature and objectives of the respective clubs.

HINDI DIWAS/ PAKHWADA

The Hindi Pakhwada was observed in the school from 14 September, 2022 to 28 September, 2022. The teachers participated in competitions held at various AEC schools, Mumbai.

INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY

International Yoga Day was celebrated by the students and teachers at Atomic Energy Central School-6, Mumbai with great enthusiasm on 21 June, 2022 from 8 am to 9.45 am. The yoga sessions were conducted under the expert supervision and guidance of Dr.Avinash Desai and his team. Students of grade VI to X demonstrated various asanas, followed by Omkar chanting. Warm up exercises were taken and all the students performed sitting and standing asanas. Importance of these were explained simultaneously. The celebration concluded with a reminder to the participants to keep performing asanas on a regular basis to remain fit and improve concentration.

AZADI KA AMRUT MAHOTSAV ACTIVITY: -

In this category as recommended by CBSE a poster making competition was held for classes 4 & 5 on the theme – The Unsung Heroes of the Freedom struggle. The activity was conducted in the secondary section as well.

ALL INDIA AEES ART COMPETITION & EXHIBITION: -

It was conducted at school level on 12th Oct. 2022 wherein 780 students participated. The students were divided into groups. A total of 119 students were shortlisted.

EK BHARAT SHRESHTA BHARAT ACTIVITIES: -

As recommended by CBSE, a total of 3 activities were conducted under this head with emphasis on the paired state of Odisha. The students were divided in groups of classes 3 to 5, 6 to 8 & classes 9 & 10. A total of 27 prizes were awarded.

LIBRARY WEEK

Library Dept. conducted Library Week celebration from 21st Nov. to 26th Nov. 2022. The different competitions like Book Review , Elocution, Poster Making and GK Quiz were organized for the students to develop reading habits among them. The certificates and prizes - first, second and third - were given to the winner participants.

Library Dept. also conducted an online quiz for students and teachers as a part of the programme of Vigilance Awareness Week 2022.

Library Dept. updates detailed information on the Library website about national festivals and National Day celebrations in India from time to time.

INTERACTIVE SESSION ON ANTIMICROBIAL RESISTANCE

An interactive session was conducted on 1st Aug,2022 on the topic Antimicrobial Resistance. The session was conducted by Dr.Mrs.Anupma Harshal, communications consultant at IISER, Pune. She introduced use of foldscope to students of class 10 to observe onion peel cells and pollen grains.

PREP&PRE-PREP ACTIVITIES

The tiny tots of Prep and Pre-prep sections were exposed to different experiences through multiple activities of sports, CCA celebrations and observances.

EDUCATIONAL TOUR

An educational trip was organised by the school for the students of classes 9 and 10 to the Centre for Science Education and Communication and IISER Pune. Students visited labs of Physics ,Chemistry and Biology at CSEC. Several exhibits and working models of educational importance were very well explained to our students by the staff of CSEC. Students also visited IISER, a very prestigious organisation at Pune. At IISER students were apprised about the importance of studying at IISER and different ways to get admission and the courses it offers at different levels. Hands on activities on the topic air pressure were demonstrated. It was very interactive and informative session.

Sixteen students from classes 9 and 10 attended the programme “Frontiers of Science 2022 at TIFR- Colaba, Mumbai on 27.11.2022

196 students of classes 3, 4 & 5 along with 12 staff members went for an educational tour to Veermata Jijabai Bhosale Udyan, (Byculla Zoo) on 29-11-2022.

SPORTS DAY AND SPORTS ROUND UP

National Sports day was observed on 29 August 2022 to commemorate the birth anniversary of hockey legend, Major Dhyan Chand With the aim to raise awareness about the values of sports: discipline, perseverance, sportsman spirit, teamwork, and to encourage public in large to take up sports and make it an integral part of their lives while emphasizing on the importance of being fit and healthy.

The Primary Sports day was conducted from 21 November 2022 to 23 November 2022. The children participated in the events with great enthusiasm and zeal. In all 40 sports activities were conducted that is 8 activities for each of the 5 classes. A total of 120 prizes were won. In all 120 students of the primary section will be receiving prizes.
